
Background

- Section 56430 of the California Government Code requires that LAFCO conduct a Municipal Service Review (MSR) to study the delivery of municipal services and adopt and update spheres of influence.
- Santa Barbara LAFCO has traditionally conducted these Service Reviews by Jurisdiction.
- The last written MSR was completed in 2012 for the Santa Ynez River Water Conservation District Improvement District No. 1.
- The Last SOI was updated in 2018 for the communities of Carpinteria Cemetery, Carpinteria/Summerland Fire, Santa Barbara Metropolitan Transit, Santa Maria Airport, and Vandenberg Village Community Services District. The Cities were updated in 2016.
- The MSR Program generally consist of reporting and discussing with local agencies regarding changes that necessitate a new Municipal Service Review to update their Spheres of Influence.


- Several approaches can be developed to update the MSR Program.
 - Continue Jurisdiction-by-Jurisdiction (covers 62 agencies)
 - Develop Region or Sub-Regions (7-areas)
 - North Area
 - South Area
 - Central Area
 - Santa Barbara Area
 - Goleta Area
 - Lompoc Area
 - Cuyama Area

 - Report by Agency/Resource Types (14 Areas)
 - Airport
 - Cities
 - Cemetery
 - County Service Areas
 - Community Services Districts
 - Embarcadero
 - Fire Protection
 - Healthcare
 - Mosquito
 - Recreation
 - Resource Conservation
 - Sanitation/Wastewater
 - Water
 - Water Management

How are MSR's being prepared




Most LAFCO's (54%) are preparing MSRs concurrently with SOI updates. 46% are preparing MSR's separate from the SOI Update process. There is not a one size fits all way of doing MSRs

The methods used are selected by the individual LAFCOs based on the particular situation or set of circumstances

 - Parks/O.S/Library/Facility Rentals (15-agencies)
 - Other Services (19-agencies)

- MSR by Resources most efficient
- MSR Program meets the intent of Section 56430 (every 5-years)
 - Volume 1 includes Fire/Police/Emergency/Safety (completed in 2021)
 - Volume 2 includes Water/Wastewater/Stormwater (completed in 2022)
 - Volume 3 includes Transportation/Parking/St Sweep & Beauty/lights/ Transit/Airport (completed in 2023)
 - Volume 4 includes Parks/O.S/Library/Rentals (completed in 2024)
 - Volume 5 includes Other Services (completed in 2025)
- Each Volume is Updated every 5th year

Recommendation

OPTION 1 – Adopt a Multi-Year Work Program:

- Direct staff to work on a MSR Program by Resource including 5 Volumes:
 - Fire/Police/Emergency/Safety (13-agencies)
 - Water/Wastewater/Stormwater (22-agencies)
 - Trans/Park/St Sweep & Beauty/lights/Transit/Airport (20-agencies)
 - Parks/O.S/Library/Facility Rentals (15-agencies)
 - Other Services (19-agencies)
