On Thursday June 2 (a week from today), LAFCO is having a hugely important meeting on the matter of Los Olivos moving forward with the Santa Ynez Community Services District (SYCSD), to build a "pocket" (stand-alone) wastewater treatment plant for Los Olivos - so that you can get off your septic system.

It is important that as many of you as possible come to this hearing! It's in Santa Maria - 30 minutes up the road from you - on THURSDAY JUNE 2, 1 P.M. in the Board of Supervisors hearing room.

RE: LAFCO June 2, 2016 - BUSINESS ITEM #3: Santa Ynez Community Services District To Include Los Olivos in The District's Sphere Of Influence

Dear LAFCO COMMISSION:	
I amOlivos.	, a property owner in the Special Problems Area of Los

I ask you to please approve the application of the Santa Ynez Community Service District for Sphere of Influence change (your LAFCO File 16-01) to include Los Olivos. And to provide direction to Staff to proceed with processing this application.

I am among a majority of Los Olivos residents who do NOT want to wait for the formation of a Los Olivos CSD - leaving us without the means to move forward to do something about our septic system problems, which are now regulated by the Santa Barbara County LAMP.

I am concerned about (PICK A SUBJECT):

- 1) THE NEW LAMP regulations for septic systems. If my septic system fails, I am required to install an advanced system at a cost of \$40K, PLUS monitor it and turn in monitoring reports once a year. Environmental Health Services has told us this and that they will have to enforce.
 - Advanced septic systems are 2x more expensive than sewer service.
 - o This expense means that when sewer service comes around, I'll not be able to participate because I've already spent the money on an advanced system.
 - If some of us start putting in advanced systems, Los Olivos will never get off septic systems.
 - We do not feel septic systems are environmentally friendly, and they have become a nuisance to us.
- 2) We want a reliable wastewater service from a reliable operator already in business. we are not willing to wait for the formation of a new CSD in Los Olivos.

3) COSTS OF WAITING - Proposition 1 funding help

- o If we wait for the formation of a Los Olivos CSD, we can easily lose MUCH funding help from Proposition 1, the State Water Bond funding that could help us. We are NOT willing to take this risk!
- o \$14 million is a lot of money to miss out on!

. 4) **REGIONAL BOARD ACTION:**

Los Olivos does not want to wait until the Regional Board comes in and regulates as it did Los Osos. (and they will).

- 5) Santa Ynez Community Services District has said repeatedly, in public meetings, that if/when a Los Olivos CSD is formed, will get the keys to the wastewater plant anyway!
 - SYCSD has explained to the Los Olivos Water Reclamation Steering Committee that while they proceed with working on getting their own CSD SYCSD would get the facility built, and then turn over the keys to the Los Olivos CSD whenever it gets formed. Then the citizens can vote to detach from SYCSD, and pay the District a fee to run the plant (as it would have to under its own wastewater plant).
 - We would have been able to get the plant built with a lot of state funding, which you can't get otherwise.

In the conclusion of your staff report for this item, Executive Officer Paul Hood states the SYCSD "application...presents an attractive alternative to forming a separate independent special district. The SYCSD has experience and is willing to step in to address the community's wastewater collection and disposal issues." We agree with this statement.

We do not agree with the following sentence that "the community of Los Olivos wishes to maintain a separate identity and is looking at forming a community services district to maintain local control." This "wish" is that of one citizen and a few people who are going along with it. The COMMUNITY of Los Olivos is a much bigger population of people who want to get moving forward with a realistic plan to handle our wastewater, to save us from being slapped with LAMP regulations, and do it while State Grant Funds are still available to help us.
