

Tour two unique San Jose environs and learn how the preservation of open space and agricultural lands and the revitalization of the downtown go hand in hand in building climate and economic resilience.

Visit scenic Coyote Valley, a 7,400-acre area located just south of San Jose, rich in natural and working lands. Once planned to be developed into another urban sprawl mini-city, the land is now the focus of intense preservation efforts. We will visit the Coyote Ridge Open Space Preserve and learn how preservation of Coyote Valley is a strategy to optimize agricultural operations on the urban edge, improve wildlife resilience and positively impact water resources.





Then travel to downtown San Jose's historic Diridon Station, on the cusp of becoming one of the most important transportation hubs in the country and one of the region's best opportunities to channel new growth, such as the anticipated Google Village, near transit. We will tour the Station area, stop at the SPUR (San Francisco Bay Area Planning and Urban Research Association) office, and hear about the City's growth strategy and its plans to transform the Station area into a great urban place, attract economic growth, and foster inclusive and sustainable development.

We will end with lunch at Olla Cocina, voted "best Mexico City-Esque Cantina," in bustling San Pedro Square.
